Permanent ownership of this dog is contingent upon your compliance with this Addendum. Proof from a licensed veterinarian of the spay/neuter must be sent to breeder within fourteen (14) days after the surgery.

This is the responsibility of the PURCHASER, not the veterinarian, to ensure that Bostie Lovebugs has received verification that the surgery has been performed. Failure to comply with this agreement by the date below, unless otherwise agreed to in writing, will be considered a breach of the **Contract**, and PURCHASER will transport this dog back to Bostie Lovebugs and will not be entitled to a refund.

By my signature below, I agree to have this dog spayed/neutered no sooner than <u>8 months</u> and by no later than <u>12 months</u>, and I understand that this spay/neuter agreement is an agreement that this dog will not produce a litter of puppies either as purposely bred or by accidental breeding. I also agree that if for some reason a life event occurs where I can no longer care for this puppy that I will return said puppy back to Bostie Lovebugs with no refund. This insures the puppy to be in the same loving environment that it has lived for the rest of its days.

SPAYING OR NEUTERING YOUR DOG IS HEALTHIER FOR THEM

<u>Males:</u> - Neutering a male eliminates the possibility of testicular tumors and efficiently reduces the chance of prostate problems. Neutered males are less likely to mark in the house.

Neutering decreases the chance of perianal tumors and hernias, that are in older non-neutered males. Neutered males are less likely to escape a yard and find a female in heat. This reduces the chance of them being hit by cars, getting into fights or lost.

<u>Females</u>: - Spayed before their second estrous cycle reduces her chance of mammary tumors, ovarian cancer and uterine infection (Pyrometra, a life threatening infection). A spayed female eliminates the neighborhood stray males from coming over or through your fence to breed with her.

<u>Note</u>: Deciding when the right time to have your dog spayed/neutered should be discussed with your veterinarian throughout growth to best determine when the surgery should take place between <u>8-12</u> months but not sooner than. Not every puppy grows at the same rate.
